The Guardians of the Cedars Party issued the following communiqué:

The current crisis has reached a wall. It threatens the country with a collapse at all levels. The constitutional institutions are dysfunctional, and fires rage across Lebanon. Tens of deaths and wounded, and the competing parties throw the ball back to their opponent. In spite of all of this, no judicial inquiry is underway to identify the responsibilities and put an end to this unending recklessness with the destiny of the people and the nation!!

The country is nearing a famine, commercial enterprises are closing their doors one after the other and unemployment is rising at an alarming pace. Droves of young people are emigrating in despair and disgust, and the government is silent. No one bother to ask why and no is called to account.

No. This is not the Lebanon that we proclaimed, nor is it the Lebanon we promised the Lebanese people. We fought for it for 30 continuous years and we offered priceless sacrifices and martyrs at its altar.

We see no hope in the rise of Lebanon before the principle of punishment and retribution is applied. The powerful ones must be subjected to the law before ordinary citizens are, and leaders must go to jail when they deserve it. Otherwise, Lebanon's condition will continue to deteriorate and all bets are up as to where the country is going.
